

*The A. Phillip Randolph Scholarship by the Brothers of the Alpha

Brother Randolph was a very influential civil rights activist and union organizer. A former student of economics and philosophy at the City College of New York, Brother Randolph became a very influential figure in the civil rights movement. As a visionary and a leader he organized the Brotherhood of Sleeping Car Porters, the nation's first predominantly African American union. He also organized the March on Washington, while Working with other civil rights leaders like Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Brother Randolph fought to eradicate segregation and worked hard to gain equal rights for all.

In honor of Brother Randolph, our scholarship will go to one male sophomore or freshman student at City College; this scholarship will help assist the student with the purchase of books or other school expenses.
